Course fees and funding

Fees for adult education courses can be found in the courses section of this guide. For long courses and those over £100, you can pay via an instalment plan to help spread the cost.

Fees for part time and 19+ courses do vary, and several courses are available to study for free. For more information and eligibility, please visit leedscitycollege.ac.uk/adult/support or call 0113 386 1997.

For learners aged 19+ many of our courses may be free if any of the following apply:



You are under 24 and have an Education Health and Care Plan from your local authority



You are wanting to join basic skills English and maths courses (not ESOL)



You are wanting to join GCSE English or maths courses and you don't already have a GCSE grade C (or 4) in that subject



You are wanting to join a computing class (EDSQ)



You are unemployed and in receipt of benefits



You are under 24 and you don't already have a qualification at Level 3 or higher



You are working and your annual salary is less than £21,255 gross per year (West Yorkshire only)*

*West Yorkshire residents only, £18,525 for residents in other non-devolved areas. It depends on the level of the course and your circumstances as to whether you can study the course for free; please ask for further information and what evidence you may need to provide. In some circumstances, even if you don't meet the above criteria, you may be able to get some financial assistance through our **Learner Support Funds** and **Student Life team**.

Adults and young people are entitled to free English, maths and digital skills tuition if they do not already have a GCSE grade 4 (previous grade C) or Level 2 qualification in that subject.

Adults under 24 studying for their first full Level 2 or Level 3 qualification may be eligible for free tuition, subject to status and depending on the course.

Community Learning (CL) Course Fees

Concessionary rates are available if you are in receipt of certain benefits and studying a course funded through Leeds City Council. Please contact us for more information or visit leedscitycollege.ac.uk

Level 3 Free Courses for Jobs

As part of their Free Courses for Jobs programme, the Government has made 400 Level 3 qualifications available to study for free. This means that if you don't already hold a Level 3 qualification (such as an A Level or equivalent), you could gain valuable new skills.

Full fees are payable, regardless of personal circumstances, if you are over 19 and have an existing Level 3 qualification – or if you are over 24, haven't previously studied at Level 3 and the course is not available through the Free Courses for Jobs scheme.

Where fees are due, an **Advanced Learner Loan** can help cover part or all of your course fees and provide financial support while you study.

You can apply for an Advanced Learner Loan if you are:



The minimum you can borrow is £300 and the maximum depends on the fees for your course. Once your offer has been confirmed and you have received our learning and funding information letter, you can register and apply for a loan online. You need to have an approved Advanced Learner Loan in place before you enrol. If you don't, you will need to discuss your options with us at enrolment.

You do not need to pay your loan back until:

You have finished your course

You earn more than £25,000 per annum

Loan repayment is at a low rate and on a 30 year term, making it more manageable for you. Plus, if you get a loan to cover tuition fees for an Access to HE course and go on to study a degree, your loan will be written off. Bursaries may be available. Instalment plan

If you choose not to take out an approved Advanced Learner Loan, or the qualification is not eligible for other public funding, you may be able to pay using an instalment plan. The minimum course fee eligible for instalments is £100. You will pay 25% of your course fees at enrolment and the remainder will be spread between one and six months, depending on your requirements and the length of your chosen course. All fees must be paid in full one month before the end of the course. Full details of the college's fees policy are available at our website: **leedscitycollege.ac.uk**

Financial support

Start date: September Study: Full time **Duration:** 1 year **Location:** Printworks Campus

Access to HE business programmes are ideal if you are looking to study a business-related degree, including business management, law, finance or marketing. These courses are widely recognised by universities as an alternative to A Levels and other Level 3 programmes, and are a valued route to university. They also support access to higher level apprenticeships in similar job roles.

This qualification is the perfect stepping stone to a creative degree at university. If you're interested in the computer games industry and want to take your knowledge of gaming to the next level, this course is an excellent platform from which to progress to further study.

You will gain a grounding in computer games development covering the fundamentals such as 3D modelling, programming, concept art and web development. Alongside subject specific knowledge, you will develop crucial skills in preparation for studying at university such as academic writing, referencing and research.

Following successful completion of this course students can progress to university to study a degree in related games subjects.

Draw out and nurture your creative talent with this one year graphic design and illustration course. Develop specialist digital and traditional techniques as you explore your own style.

Learning in our supportive environment gives you the space to create and experiment with different techniques. Study takes place within a studio setting as well as online and culminates in an exhibition.

Successful completion of this course will allow progression to university.

This diverse and interesting course is ideal for those interested in studying social work, psychology, sociology, criminology or social policy at university.

As well as acquiring the subject knowledge and skills required for undergraduate study of the social sciences, you will also develop a range of skills such as research and academic writing, ensuring you can embark on university study with confidence.

Covering psychology, sociology and social policy, the course also allows you to choose from modules allowing you to tailor the course to your particular area of interest. Example units include crime and deviance, psychology and social work.

This access course gives you the foundational knowledge in psychology, sociology, criminology and social policy, enabling you to pursue a degree in social science at university.

Access to HE Social Sciences with Psychology Specialism

This course is ideal for those with an interest in psychology who are looking to study it at university.

Covering the fundamentals of psychology, including behavioural, cognitive, psychodynamic and humanistic approaches, this fascinating course will give you the grounding you need to go on to further study.

As well as exploring statistics, biological and psychological aspects of health and illness and developmental psychology, you will also undertake a research project based on your personal interests.

Following the course you can pursue your interests further through reading a degree in psychology or related subjects.

Are you interested in environmental issues? Are you passionate about climate science? Our Environmental and Climate Science course is designed for you.

Deepen your understanding of the environment and climate through exploration of topics such as pollution, water management and genetics. Learn about field and lab techniques as you study units in biology, chemistry, mathematics and environmental sciences.

Following this course you can pursue your interests by reading related degrees such as geology, environmental sciences, ecology or marine biology.

Get to university in a year with our Access to HE Computer Science course.

Develop the knowledge and practical skills you need to pursue a career in computer science. Our course covers networking, programming, project management and the exciting world of emerging technologies.

With the skills and knowledge you will have upon completion of this course, you can look forward to starting a degree in computer science subjects, such as applied computing or cyber security.



This diploma will prepare you for a variety of engineering qualifications.

You will broaden your knowledge in multiple areas of engineering, such as mechanical, medical and electrical. The course will see you develop your maths, physics, engineering and academic skills, while learning about electricity and electromagnetism, calculus, and waves and optics. You will also conduct a design project within an engineering context.

Ideally placed for anyone looking to study engineering, completion of this course paves the way for learning at a higher level. Progression includes undertaking qualifications such as Electrical and Electronic Engineering HNC/D; Manufacturing Engineering HNC/D; or a Leadership and Management (Engineering) foundation degree.

If you want to enter the medical profession or have an interest in reading biology or chemistry at degree level, this course will give you the grounding you need.

Studying in laboratories and taught by specialist tutors, you will further your knowledge of biology, chemistry and maths. Covering subjects such as organic compounds, structure and functions of the body, and applications of scientific, statistical and epidemiological problems, this interesting course prepares you for scientific study at university.

As well as deepening your medical knowledge, this one year course also concentrates on improving your academic report writing, equipping you with the skills you will need in order to learn at a higher level.

Progression following this course includes reading medicine, medical sciences, biology or chemistry based degrees. If you are a keen scientist or are wanting to pursue a career in science, our access course could see you starting a science degree in just one year.

Covering a fascinating range of biology and chemistry modules, ranging from infection and immunity to energy and equilibria, you will further your scientific knowledge. You will also improve your academic skills such as referencing and academic writing. To ensure you are ready for degreelevel study you will develop your mathematical skills, studying algebra, logarithms, statistics and calculus.

Following completion of this course you can embark upon a scientific degree and pursue careers in pharmacy, biomedical science and nutrition.

Level 3 Diploma

5 GCSE Pathway, including English and Maths

If you want to work in travel and tourism our access course is the ideal starting point for your career journey.

You will explore the links between travel, tourism and business management, and gain understanding of how together they contribute to the success of the travel sector.

Units include responsible tourism, marketing and business. You will also learn and develop study skills, such as academic writing, by way of preparation for studying at a higher level.

Upon successful completion of this course you can further your study of the industry by reading a degree in travel and tourism. Employment opportunities following acquisition of a degree include tourism and travel management. If you plan on pursuing a new career or further study but don't have the qualifications to do so, our Access Foundation (five GCSEs) or Fast-Track Science GCSE (combined) courses can help.

Access Foundation (five GCSEs)

Work towards gaining passes in five GCSEs, including English Language, maths and science. Lessons are spread out across three full days and as well as subject-specific study, you will also strengthen your academic skills, such as writing and presenting.

Fast-Track Science GCSE (Combined)

This exciting double GCSE science award combines biology, chemistry and physics. It is ideal if you require science GCSEs to progress into primary teaching, nursing or a scientific Level 3 route. Morning and evening classes are available and your studies will be split between classroom and home study.

Please note, to be eligible for this course you will need a minimum grade 4 in GCSE maths and a minimum grade 3 in English.
